
Merry Christmas Happy New Year

The 2012 Special Olympics Fall Games were a big success. Our Club participated in the Healthy Athlete Program by partnering with Chapman College to give hearing tests and evaluations to the Athletes. For the first time the program was offered at three different locations over the three days. On Friday evening Healthy Hearing testing was at the Athletes Hotel at the Wyndham Hotel in Irvine, on Saturday testing was at the RINKS (location of Floor Hockey) in Irvine and on Sunday testing was at the Fountain Valley Sports Park (location of Soccer, Softball, Tennis and Volleyball). Lion Steve Nichols did an outstanding job of driving the Lions Health Screenings Unit Van and moving it to all the locations at the appropriate time over the three days. Lions working at the Fall Games were Lions Steve Nichols, Ruri Pierre, Wayne Martin, Hilda & Sergio Ortega, Ron Copley, and Rosa & Jerry Masterson. Hearing testing and evaluations were given to 78 athletes on Friday, 26 athletes on Saturday and 72 athletes on Sunday for a total of 176 athletes tested. All the Athletes and Coaches were grateful for the program and our participation. Well done SOLA Lions.


"ONE HEART, ONE WORLD"

SOLA members were saddened to hear of the passing of Past Lions International President Kay K. Fukushima, a personal friend to several of our club members. His memorial service was held Friday afternoon, December 14, at the Elks Lodge in Sacramento.

President Fukushima "traveled to 78 countries and met with many leaders, including Chinese President Jiang Zemin, Pope John Paul II, Prince Charles of Great Britain and Prince Rainier of Monaco. Under his leadership, the Lions reorganized clubs in China that had been disbanded during the communist revolution and started their first club in Vatican City. He also visited and supported organizational improvements in African countries. During his year as president, "my husband was only home 24 days," said his wife, Denise. "He had speaking engagements all over the world. He was very good at inspiring people to get involved."







SOLA's bowling tournament is scheduled for October 20, 2012. I look forward to seeing everyone there.





President's Message



SOLA Lions Honored to Have Patrick McClenahan Speak

Patrick McClenahan is President and Chief Executive Officer of the 2015 Special Olympics World Games and spoke at our June 20th meeting about the plans for the games and how our SOLA Lions Club might participate in the "Host City Program."

The World Games consists of 9 days, 24 different sports and athletes from 170 countries. Three days before the 9 days is called the "Host City Program."

The Host City Program is where cities and communities throughout Southern California can host one or more delegations from visiting countries. This allows athletes to get acclimated to the time zone, to put on exhibitions and rallies, and where the Host City supports those delegations for the 9 days of competition.

Patrick gave a brief overview of the Special Olympics Summer World Games in Dublin, Ireland (2003), Shanghai, China (2007), and Athens, Greece (2011) and spoke of the bidding process for securing the 2015 Games in L.A. He recalled the standing ovation Tim Shriver received when he spoke in Ireland "about inclusion, about dignity revolution, about one day students without intellectual disabilities, are going to look across the field and know that student with disabilities because they've played together on the field of sports." Last summer in Athens, "an athlete from Greece and an athlete from the United States presented a resolution to the head of all of Education [in Greece] that they establish Special Education in Greece. All people with intellectual disabilities are relegated to other separate facilities and they don't have Special Education. A lot we take for granted here in the United States. A very emotional moment when they did that, and when the Prime Minister and the President pledged their support to change that."

".... our real focus is on legacy and impact, how we reach the next generation with that message of inclusion and accepting people with differences, not just intellectual disabilities. Eunice Shriver believed it went beyond that. Once you did that you were more accepting of people of all differences. What a great opportunity to do that in Los Angeles."

The Special Olympics Summer World Games 2015 will feature 24 sports venues, 7,000 athletes and 3,000 coaches/chaperones from 170 countries, all athletes housed in the dorms at USC and UCLA; provide 350,000 healthy meals and transporting each athlete to their competition venue within 20 minutes travel time. The total budget: \$85,000,000 with no government or taxpayer monies. For more information, check out the website: www.losangeles2015.org.

Laura shared with us the Healthy Athlete Program for Special Olympics and suggested ways SOLA can become important partners at the coming June 8-10 Summer Games in Long Beach.

Special Olympics provides athletes with a variety of free health screenings, including dental, vision, hearing, physical therapy, podiatry and nutrition. People with intellectual disabilities have a 40 percent greater risk for health issues and typically receive substandard or no health care.

Particularly on Friday, the group home Special Olympics athletes will come in vans to receive the various health screenings offered by on-site doctors. In addition to our hearing screening efforts as in the past with the Eyemobile, "Escort Ambassadors" are needed to escort the athletes to the various exams. Also the doctors need help with the paperwork. This will greatly increase the effectiveness of the Healthy Athlete Program.

Laura brought along a Special Olympics athlete, Dustin, who has become a "Global Messenger" for the Healthy Athlete Program. He shared a wonderful story of how this program literally "saved his life" by catching an illness in time. He calls the Special Olympics "his second family."

I hope to see you at the next District 4-L2 Lions Convention, May 10 –12, 2012 in Cathedral City, California.






