

The 125th Rose Parade is themed "Dreams Come True." The theme is a reminder that not only is it possible to attain the seemingly unattainable through extraordinary focus, effort, and belief in the probability of success, but that it has been done. Throughout all of human history, we have achieved "the impossible" by believing in the power of our dreams.

Giving Children of All Abilities a Place to Play

Liz Lamach wanted what all moms want - a safe place for her son to play with other kids. But her son Matteo has cerebral palsy. And most playgrounds don't have the ramps or the space he needs to move his wheelchair.

The Lions Step In

Liz was determined to find a way to create a place where children of all abilities could come together and play. After some research, Liz began to plan for a new playground. But with a cost of nearly US\$750,000, it would take a lot more than she could give.



Matteo's Dream - A Playground for Children of All Abilities

Liz rallied the local Lions, and with a generous US\$75,000 grant from LCIF, the project began. Lions from 45 clubs went on to raise almost US\$500,000. They also joined forces with other community groups to build the park themselves. In just eight days, 3,000 volunteers erected the 12,000 square foot playground. Ron Hudson from the Dawn Breakers Lions Club was one of them. "I spent eight days building Matteo's Dream," he said, "and it was the best thing I have ever done in my life."



Open to Everyone

When "Matteo's Dream: A Playground for Children of All Abilities" opened to the public, local parents like Tamara Borba were elated. They finally had a place where their children could play alongside siblings with special needs. "To have Matteo's Dream in our neighborhood is wonderful," said Borba. "Both my kids can play. Nicky can be set free. He can wheel himself up and down the ramps and play with everything." Laura Hoffmesiter, the former mayor of Concord, added, "The dream really did become a reality. And we hope this can become a model for other communities."

Fun Facts

This project reestablished the Concord Lions Club with Liz as the charter president. The Concord Lions Club not only maintains the playground – but it also holds club meetings there.



Matteo's Dream - A Playground for Children of All Abilities opened to the public on May 16, 2007. Located in Hillcrest Park at 2050 Olivera Rd., the playground project was spearheaded by Concord resident Liz Lamach whose son, Matteo, uses a wheelchair and is blind.

As a member of the City of Concord Parks, Recreation and Open Space Commission and the Lions Club of Contra Costa and Alameda Counties, Lamach brought people together to make Matteo's dream of an accessible playground a reality.

During the build that took place from April 20 to 29, 2007 over 2,000 volunteers constructed the massive playground, the largest in Concord covering an area a third the size of a football field. The City donated the land at Hillcrest Park and provided \$232,000 in park funds. Lions Club members raised an additional \$500,000 and solicited in-kind donations and volunteers.

President's Message


Dear Fellow Lions,






SOLA Lions Guest Speaker Red Godfrey




SOLA Lions to Assist at SELA Area Softball Tournament in Lakewood - October 5, 2013.




President's Message



"With this remarkable commitment, they're putting the funding and strength of their global grassroots organization in direct service for one of the world's most marginalized populations. There's no greater service organization than Lions, and the athletes, families, volunteers and fans of Special Olympics worldwide are proud to stand with their members in service to others."

Lions Clubs International has been supporting Special Olympics with a focus on health through the Special Olympics-Lions Clubs International Opening Eyes vision screening program. Now, this five-year renewal and increased support will create leadership opportunities for Special Olympics athletes, increase the health work of Special Olympics, conduct outreach to families for additional support and allow for both organizations to reach more young people through inclusive sports and advocacy programs in an effort to achieve full acceptance and inclusion of people with intellectual disabilities in their communities.

"Lions Clubs International is honored to serve as a global partner of Special Olympics," said Chairperson Tam. "For many years, we have worked side by side in the field of vision care for those with intellectual disabilities, and we are so excited to expand the scope of our collaboration to meet additional needs in our communities. This expanded global partnership provides an opportunity for our Lions and Leo members to engage in new service opportunities like hearing health, family support, inclusive sports, membership development, and much more."

As part of the partnership announcement, Lions Clubs International Foundation Chairperson Dr. Tam Wing-kun made Yao Ming an honorary Lions Clubs member for his dedication to serving children throughout China.

Since 2001, Special Olympics and Lions Clubs International have screened more than 325,000 Special Olympics athletes, and with the help of global suppliers Essilor International and Safilo Group, have provided more than 100,000 athletes with high quality prescription eyeglasses. The expanded partnership will utilize the proven collaborative model exhibited through Opening Eyes, with the focus on creating additional health and social impacts to empower individuals with intellectual disabilities, their families, and their communities.

In addition to empowering people with intellectual disabilities to achieve their best both on and off the playing field, the partnership is designed to highlight the global and community leadership offered by Lions Clubs International, the largest service organization in the world, and a global leader in humanitarian service.

"Thank you Lions Clubs for your continued support, but more importantly for your belief in people like me," said Ben Haack, Special Olympics Australia athlete. "Your support will allow us to reach more young people and empower our athletes to be leaders. We are so excited to work closely with Lions Clubs throughout the world to bring your mission, 'We Serve', to every corner of the Special Olympics Movement. These actions will help build understanding and break down barriers and bullying and will create communities of acceptance everywhere."

In 2001, Lions Clubs International Foundation awarded Special Olympics the first grant in a multi-year, multi-million dollar commitment in the expansion of the Opening Eyes vision screening program. Special Olympics - So. California



CEO/President of Special Olympics Southern California started his informal speech excited about the 45% of So. Cal Special Olympics athletes who are now in the "school games program" at local schools. Athletes as young as 5th grade get their first taste of Special Olympics. ESPN will be the world wide presenting sponsor of "United Sports." Our athletes play on the same teams as the other kids.

In February the Department of Education edict: "If any institution/school is using federal funds/dollars, it will provide equitable training and competition opportunities for students with handicaps." (Very similar to the edict 20 years ago for equitable programs for female athletes.)

In 5 states (not yet in California) one can earn a letter in Varsity, Jr. Varsity AND United Sports. Our Special Olympics athletes can walk around campus wearing a letterman's jacket! Wow!

The <u>Special Olympics Southern California</u> organization is going extraordinarily well. It moved its headquarters to West Long Beach to a business park near 405 & 710 freeways, bringing both the Gardena staff and the Long Beach staff together under one roof.

<u>Regarding the Summer World Games</u> – just 2 years away. The Games Organizing Committee needs \$80,000,000 to pull this off; now has 9 employees, 35 by the end of the year, and when totally staffed and ready to put on the games, 155 employees.

The scope of the World Games: 107 countries, 7,000 athletes, \$400,000,000 economic impact to Southern California. It will be the largest sports and humanitarian event in the world in 2015. Competition in 26 spots, at 7 competition hubs, and 7,000 athletes housed at 2 Olympic Villages: USC, and UCLA. Imagine the language issues, medical issues, transportation, and logistics. We have very smart and forward thinking people working on this.

<u>Host Towns Project.</u> Unique to Special Olympics, upon landing at LAX, the athletes will be shipped out to approximately 100 different communities. For three days, each Host Town Committee will arrange housing, food, cultural events, and opportunities for training and practice for a contingency of special Olympic athletes from one or more countries. The ultimate purpose is to change and impact those athletes for the rest of their lives [through genuine American hospitality, goodwill and cheering them on].

When asked which sports, Bill listed "off the cuff" canoeing, sailing, open water swimming, beach volleyball, triathlon, tennis, soccer, softball, swimming, basketball, track and field, badminton, gymnastics, bowling, judo, handball, horseback, golf, and cycling.

Opening Eyes Program



LCIF and Special Olympics began a partnership in 2001 to provide free vision screenings at select Special Olympics sporting events worldwide. Research has shown that among Special Olympics athletes, 68 percent have not had an eye examination in three years, 37 percent are in need of eyeglasses and 18 percent wear clinically-incorrect eyeglasses. The athletes are largely an underserved group when it comes to vision care and they deserve, and should have access to, quality care that is appropriate to their particular needs.

This partnership resulted in the Opening Eyes Program under the Healthy Athlete Program in Special Olympics. This program relies on thousands of volunteer Lions, doctors, vision specialists and educators. Since the program started more than 250,000 athletes have been

screened, with prescription eyewear provided to nearly 99,000 athletes. A total of 10,500 doctors have been recruited and trained through the program. More than 16,000 Lions volunteers worldwide have offered their time and talents for this true team effort. The Opening Eyes program is funded by an LCIF Core 4 grant. Since the program began, the Foundation has awarded more than \$13.3 million in grant funding for this program. This year the amount of the grant was \$1.0 million.

SOLA Lions Club has been active in the Healthy Athlete Program in Southern California since we were formed. The Healthy Athletes Program offers free health screenings at the Summer and Fall Games competitions. This program consists of Fit Feet (podiatry), FUNfitness (physical therapy), Health Promotion (better health and well-being), Healthy Hearing (audiology), Opening Eyes (vision), and Special Smiles (dentistry). Since 1997 more than one million Special Olympic Athletes have been screened in over 100 Countries. We have been active in the Healthy Hearing part of the program at both the Summer and Fall games in part-

nership with Chapman University in Orange. Working with Dr. Judy Montgomery and her students in Audiology has been very gratifying. Lions throughout the world and the SOLA Lions Club are making a difference in serving the Special Olympics Athletes.
