SOSC President/CEO Bill Shumard Speaks at SOLA

Special Olympics Southern California President and CEO Bill Shumard favored us with a visit on August 3 to welcome Lion Steve Nichols as our new Club President and wish all of us a great year serving our SELA area Special Olympics athletes. It's always our pleasure to have Bill as our guest and hear the latest scoop about the World Games coming to Los Angeles in 2015 and its implication for the future of Special Olympics in our Southern California area.



Key points of his presentation were:

- It's only one year until the World Games 2015 begin July 25 to August 2
- 7,000 athletes from 170+ countries, 3,000 coaches, 5,000 honored guests, 30,000 volunteers, 500,000 spectators, 2,000 media representatives, 9 days, 27 venues.
- President Barack Obama and First Lady Michelle will serve as Honorary Chairs.
- The World Games have some great sponsors and financial supporters including Bank of America, California Community Foundation, Coca-Cola, Kaiser Permanente, (also Rose Hills Foundation), yet they need many more.
- ESPN has become the Official Media Service for the World Games, and will televise both the Opening and Closing Ceremonies, along with dedicating an hour each day of programming on Events and Special Segments.
- Toyota is the Official Transportation for the World Games, after making a 5 million dollar donation to the Games.
- The HostTown 2015 program is unique to these games, in which the City of Whittier
 will be hosting a delegation of Special Olympics athletes from one or more nations
 in pre-game cultural and sports activities and cheering them on during the games;
 over 50 communities out of the 70 to 100 needed have now volunteered.
- "Unified Program" Through the "Unified Program," Special Olympics is encouraging local school districts, with the help of the CIF, to allow Special Olympics athletes/students to participate on "regular" Freshmen, Junior Varsity, and Varsity sports teams throughout the year. The athletes would be a member of each of the teams, rather than playing separately, and then hopefully would be given a "Letter" for their achievement at the conclusion of the season. Currently the Los Angeles School District is on board with this plan.
- Local sporting events, like the one's SOLA is sponsoring each year, are desperately needed to meet the needs of the thousands of athletes joining Special Olympics teams.

We look forward to this coming year serving our local Special Olympics athletes and seeing Bill Shumard joining us at some of the events. What a great encourager he is! Thanks Bill!

A Special Evening with Stephen Neill

Stephen Neill, Senior Vice President,
Global Development and Government
Relations with Special Olympics in Washington, DC,
spoke at SOLA Lions Club Meeting on Monday, March 24
accompanied by Joann Kionowski,
Vice President, HostTowns LA 2015.



"When we met in Hamburg I meant what I said. I would love to come out to see this club because, probably you don't realize it but, from the newsletters that come out, to the word on the street, this club is well known and admired by so many in Special Olympics, to recognize what you all have done.

"This morning (at the World Games stakeholder's meeting) we shared a couple of stories that I think really, in my mind, embodies the spirit of Lionism and of Special Olympics. One you guys were involved in. It was an event that took place in Malawi, in Africa just a couple months ago, that I was privileged to be a part of. It was a conference that was held by the President of Malawi, focused on the rights of people with intellectual disabilities. And this club helped raise a significant -from Malawi, an enormous-- amount of money that is helping Special Olympics in Malawi buy a van. In Malawi its just hard to understate the significance of what that means to the lives of people with intellectual disabilities. It's going to allow us to identify problems through Healthy Athletes screening, and Opening Eyes screening, and most importantly, actually get them to these Lions hospitals, and when follow up care is needed, to get to physicians; it is literally lifechanging. The support that this club gave for that van initiative . . if you'd all been there, you'd understand on a far deeper level exactly what that means to Special Olympics in Malawi.

"The thing about that event was that, in conjunction with the major governments convening that we had with heads of state, government ministers

from 13 African countries, and development fund -ers, aid agencies, and all these different audiences who have their influences in the power that can change the lives of people with intellectual disabilities, we had a unified soccer match to really underscore the power of sports as a platform for change and for mobilizing communities. And if you go to a place like Malawi, you really understand the stigma and the stereotype and the discrimination that people with intellectual disabilities and their families face is really entrenched, and really difficult to overcome. By bringing them out on the field to play . .with footballers and high profile politicians . . we were able to break down some of those barriers and let them see what people with intellectual disabilities can accomplish if they're given a chance.

"So we were planning this major event in the national stadium, seats 10,000 people,(as beatup a stadium as you'd ever seen in your life; in the developing world where everything is challenging) . . . We needed to get this event off the ground; we had commitments from top footballers, from the athletes, from the government officials. We didn't have anything to pull this event off though, no resources. The government had no money there are no volunteers - people are worried about survival so we called Lions leadership in the country. "We need twenty volunteers to help us to somehow pull this event off." Two hundred Lions showed up. For part of the planning for this event, they repainted the stadium, they hung the banners, they lined the fields, they moved the grass, they were officials,

they were vendors. There were Lions driving a sound truck through neighborhoods promoting the event. . . . In a country where there's no culture of volunteerism, where people are really focused on what they need to do in order to get by -- the average income is a dollar a day. Lionism is vibrant and strong in support of Special Olympics. it shows you the power of Lions to mobilize communities in support of social change.

"Today we talked a little bit about some of the ideas in which we can replicate that magic on a much bigger scale -- if they can do that in Malawi -- I hate to even think of what we can accomplish here in support of the World Games in 2015. Seven thousand athletes, coming for 9 days of competition in every summer sport that we offer, the world will really turn its attention on Los Angeles and on our athletes as stars. We had a great meeting today in which we talked about specific ways that we can look to mobilize this club, but also some of the other Lions Clubs in the district and across the state.

"Joann Kionowski is the "driver" behind the Host Towns - you will experience it here in Whittier and across the state - it's one of the best parts about the World Games experience when communities embrace athletes who come from around the world, from places like Malawi, or Rwanda, or Pakistanyou will see athletes who have come and their life experience is culminating in many ways in this experience to be celebrated on a global stage at the World Games. In the Host Town experience, communities just embrace these athletes in a way that they've never been before in their home cities, in their schools—if they're lucky enough to go to one— in their communities. . . . and you can just read it on their faces what it means to them."




