Thank you to all our wonderful sponsors, and to all the volunteers who worked very hard to raise an estimated \$17,000 profit for our athletes.





Thank you for your commitment and participation to SOLA.





So [A Spotlight on

Do you know what it is?

I didn't, and learned about its existence when interviewing Tony La Reaux for our Summer SOLAMATION featured athlete article. I learned that Tony attends the "Stride Program" at the Uptown Y Family Center, 5 days-a-week from 8:30am to 2:30pm. Tony thinks of it as "going to work."

I called "our very own" Lion Penny to

arrange a visit and was warmly welcomed by STRIDE's teachers and "consumers" (that's what program participants are called). Following is an Interview with Penny Lopez, Executive Director of Administrative Service of the YMCA of Greater Whittier. She used to oversee the STRIDE program and still writes Grants for STRIDE.

STRIDE has been part of the Y's outreach program since 1975. It is designed to meet the needs of the Intellectually and Developmentally Disabled Adults Community (*IDD*) in our city and surrounding area.

One can't just "walk in" and apply though. Consumers must be referred by their *Regional Center* which assigns a Case Worker to assure that the best possible program is chosen for the consumer.


Stride is open to Special Needs persons who graduate from the IDD program at a High School. IDD High School Graduation age is 22. Program is at capacity currently with 30 adults.

Program Goals:

- Help everyone achieve their highest potential.
- Help integrate "consumers" into the community by increasing their independence and enhancing their quality of life.

Consumers learn **life skills** (e.g.: set a routine, learn communication skills, practical math, computer usage, read simple instructions, healthy lifestyle,

YMCA Stride Program



Consumers learn **responsibility for others**; community integration by outings into the community (e.g. Farmer's Market, visit to library, eat out at a restaurant, Dodger Stadium, trip to Camp Arbolado).

Consumers **help in the community** through volunteering at Goodwill, Bridge of Faith, Meals on Wheels and the YMCA by sorting clothes, newspapers etc.; run a "coffee-shop" where, in the morning, two consumers sell coffee and snacks and learn to count money and make change.

You can visit Stride, just make an appointment, or wait for the Open House. Ask for Sienna, 562-945-5304

On a personal note: One of Penny's relatives is Tim. Tim attended STRIDE where he discovered his love for Bowling and Swimming many years ago. He also took part in the Special Olympics program. Tim is now working at the Marriot Residence Inn and has for 30 some years); he has no problems using the Bus system by himself, has a great sense of humor and can remember things that interest him forever!

The first time I saw Tony, who is deaf, and his Dad George, they were communicating so intensely their fingers and lips moving in unison while they were smiling at each other, that I had to take a photo. When sharing the photo with SOLA friends, Ron Copley shared that he had known Tony for quite some time and that Tony has improved his stroke tremendously.

Being deaf, I wondered, how can Tony compete? Parents are not allowed on deck during competition. Tony cannot hear the

starter air horn. What to do? Father George asked Ron (our starter at the Swim meet) if he could give Tony the start instructions by putting his hand on Tony's back and lifting it when the starter's air horn went off. Ron agreed and Tony was able to compete on "equal turf".

Tony is a Member of the Sea Monkeys (our Whittier Swim Team) and competed in 3 races that day. How do we applaud a deaf athlete? WAVE. Wave higher than your shoulders. The more vigorously you wave, the louder you "clap" for Tony.

When I interviewed Tony and his parents at their home, I enjoyed their warmth, love and the twinkle in Tony's eyes. Mom Ruth shared that Tony has always wanted to make everyone smile – even as a little child. He made me smile and took my breath away when I saw the plethora of shining Bronze, Silver, Gold medals along with ribbons for Gold, Silver and Bronze achievements on display. An awe-inspiring sight and only a part of his achievements.

Tony will be 24 on September 16^{th.} He was only 15 months old when he started the Infant Program at Leffingwell Elementary. This is a very special program in the District and the reason Tony's parents moved to Whittier. George and Ruth wanted to give their son the best education available. Tony's parents and his sister, Sarah, who also happens to be Tony's role model, are very encouraging and supportive of his activities and communicate with him in sign language. Tony loves technology. He has a phone, which he uses for texting friends and also has an itouch that he uses out in the community.

During the week Tony attends the Uptown Whittier YMCA's 30-hour week STRIDE program*.

He is a dedicated athlete, enjoys swimming (butterfly is his hardest event), basketball, and bowling. Tony practices his swimming skills 3 days a week at the Uptown Y.

He likes to try new things. Recently he tried MMA boxing, right here at a boxing store on Whittier Blvd. What else does he love? Rides at the O.C. Fair, movies with friends, Game Night at the Park, Sign Language Class, Pizza, Mexican food, VWs, helping his neighbor raise funds for Special Olympics in the Hot-Chocolate-Booth* at Christmas time and skiing! His favorite place to ski? Big Bear.

On the weekend Tony and his Parents attend *Holy Angels Catholic Church of the Deaf* in Vernon. Tony serves as a Eucharistic Minister. He enjoys assisting the priest in administering the sacraments of Holy Communion.






Sola 2017 District 4-L2 Lions Convention

Woman of the Year 2017 Award

Lion Ruri Pierre

On Thursday, March 30, 2017 California State Assembly Majority Leader Ian Calderon celebrated Women's History Month by honoring distinguished women of the 57th Assembly District who have made a difference in the community. One of the nine women honored was our own Ruri "Peanuts" Pierre. Following is the write-up on Ruri that was submitted by Greg Alaniz, Director of Parks, Recreation, and Community Services for the City of Whittier:



Upon receiving the application for the 2017 Distinguished Women of the Year Awards 57th Assembly District, only one special lady came to mind, Ms. Ruri "Peanuts" Pierre. What a wonderful opportunity to acknowledge this truly remarkable woman who has made Senior Services and Therapeutic Recreation her life's mission. Ms. Pierre has been a City of Whittier employee for almost 35 years, currently running the Senior Citizen and Therapeutic Recreation programs. For most people this would be enough to fulfill their life; however, Ms. Pierre dedicates her "spare "time by being an instrumental leader for Special Olympics.



Ms. Pierre has been involved with the Special Olympics for approximately 40 years. Beginning as a volunteer while attending California State University Fresno in 1976, she realized her love of coaching and made sure the Special Olympic athletes were able to attend as many tournaments as possible. She has coached Special Olympians in several sports and has developed the City of Whittier Special Olympics Program into one of the finest in all of Southern California. Whittier has athletes participating in swimming, basketball, bowling, softball, and track and field.

Ms. Pierre has mentored many other coaches and is always willing to share her experience with other program coordinators. Recently, Ms. Pierre helped start a Special Olympics Program in the City of Pico

Rivera. She calls thousands of athletes and coaches friends (they know that she loves them). In 2010, she was awarded the "Harahan Award" by Special Olympics Southern California for being the "Volunteer of the Year" for the Los Angeles and San Gabriel Valley Regions.

In 2009, she helped form a Special Olympics Lions Club in the Whittier area which is specifically dedicated to serving the athletes of Special Olympics. Ms. Pierre was also instrumental in working with the Lions Club to start four much needed Special Olympics competitions. She helps coordinate an annual Christmas Party for 350 athletes and coaches. Special Olympics competing winter events are Speed Skating, Figure Skating, Floor Hockey, Floorball, Stick Shooting, Alpine Skiing, Snowboarding, Cross Country, and Snow Shoeing. Two demonstration events featured this year are Dancing, and MATP (Motor Activity Training Program).

What a wonderful opportunity Special Olympics gives these athletes—one of inclusion and community. We celebrate these athletes, for they show the world that they are truly champions.

As I was on the last leg of my trip this evening I had to reflect on the events of the week. But, words cannot begin to describe the experience.

As early as I can remember a New Year's tradition was to watch the Tournament of Roses Parade. At the age of 31, I lost my sight. So for the last 16 years I would not turn on the TV to watch it, because it would make me sad. It was not many things that saddened me about losing my sight; parades and fireworks were two of those things.

So this year California Lions invited me to walk along side of the 100 year Lions Club float. I also was able to participate in helping decorate the float.

This morning Jan 2nd we began at 5:30 am making our way through residential neighborhoods in Pasadena to be dropped off to walk to where the floats are staged. Then at 8:02am the stealth bomber does its flyover to officially launch the 128th Annual Rose Parade and we began the 5.5 mile journey.

With about a million people lining the parade route, 50 million people watching in the US and it is guessed about another 70 million watching worldwide Lions Clubs International 100 years of service was showcased.

The theme of the parade **Echoes of Success** rang throughout the parade but to Lions that is something that echoes throughout the world everyday as the largest humanitarian organization in the world with more than 1.4 million members changing lives everyday. Lions from all over the US play a pivotal role in creating sustainable independence right here in Little Rock for people who are blind and visually impaired everyday.

World Services for the Blind was highlighted as one of their service projects. Lions have assisted World Services for the Blind in their mission since 1947 to serve more than 13,000 people from all fifty states and from 58 countries to gain the skills needed to live independently and have careers in their fields of choosing.

So the experiences were awesome. Thank you California Lions for everything. Thank you for the warm welcome again and for allowing me to join you in Lionism.

An Evening with Bill Shumard, SOSC President and CEO

It's always a treat to have Bill Shumard speak to us about how Special Olympics Southern California is finding new ways to meet the needs of the athletic community it serves. Here's just a taste of his presentation:

- In 2005 Special Olympics served 8,000 athletes of an average age of 37. By the end of 2016 more than 28,000 athletes of an average age of 16 are being served.
- Special Olympics Southern California is a financially stable entity thanks, in part, to the 2015 World Games. Even the State of California now recognizes the importance of Special Olympics and supports the athletes with big bucks through the

Department of Education. Over 150 California high schools now offer Unified Sports programs.

- There is a new Strategic Plan being worked on that will spread 12 sports over 2 seasons. Some sports like Bowling and Field Hockey will have "their own season." This change is designed to encourage our athletes to participate in more than one sport.
- A concept called "Team Wellness" (Bill likened it to "Boot Camp") for our athletes is focusing on year-round physical fitness and healthy nutrition. This ties into the "Healthy Athletes" program. Charity Navigators, America's largest independent charity evaluator, in 2005 rated the Special Olympics organization with only one star *; in 2016 Charity Navigators now rated us with 4 stars * * *. Our resources are considered to be in good hands.
- Albertsons, Vons and Pavilion grocery stores now have a "check stand donation" system that, as of July 21, 2016, contributed 1.2 million dollars to the Special Olympics treasuries in Southern and Northern California.
